Then, for the Long Island/NYC area, we'll have our first performance at the newly-renovated <u>Boulton Center</u> For The <u>Performing Arts</u> in Bay Shore! JD Sarantakos (of Criss Angel

Mindfreak TV show) and his business partner, George Peterson, came down to see the Manticore livestream from Blockhead TV Studio in Farmingdale and instantly fell in love. JD contacted us the very next day and insisted that we bring our show to an intimate, local venue that he happens to be producing and presenting multiple shows at - The Boulton Center in Bay Shore - and give Long Island a



healthy serving of Emerson Lake & Palmer! In addition to the performance, he insisted we include a VIP package for fans to get an extra dose of Manticore with their show, and we were delighted to oblige. So this particular show has 24 seats - the front two rows - set aside for VIP patrons to come early, see some of the sound check, have photos taken with the band while seated behind Little John's drums (a bash of the big gong is included), and each VIP guest will go home with an autographed 11"x17" poster of Manticore in action!
