We've made it through the beginning of the 2022 holiday season... hopefully you've all stayed happy and healthy and the Christmas music (that started pre-Halloween this year) hasn't gotten to you yet - you still have at least another 3 weeks to endure. But great things are still yet to come before the year ends - let's review a little first.

November was special. Anticore and Carl Palmer both played, not only on the same continent, but in the same state!! Ok, at different times and in different places, but it was really one step closer to worlds colliding....yes, that's our dream - of Carl showing up at a Manticore performance, sitting in with the band and acknowledging that, as a rising tide floats all boats, his presence is as beneficial to him as it is for us. That the same folks that love the original sound of ELP from the old days also love the music by an original member recreated in a unique, innovative fashion, with different instrumentation. That it's not a question of "either/or" but a pursuit of more and more.....yet I digress..... Auntion had a wonderful show last month at the glorious, historic Strand Theatre in beautiful Hudson Falls, NY and Carl Palmer's Legacy band did a magnificent job at the Patchogue Theater in Patchogue and the Sony Hall in NYC (we know - we were at the Patchogue Theater cheering him on). Carl did his new incarnation with matched, high-def video screens mounted on either side of the stage. His Return of ELP Tour was set up so that he could perform with his nowdeceased bandmates, Keith Emerson and Greg Lake. Using original



footage from ELP's Royal Albert Hall performance in 1992, Carl isolated Keith and Greg's tracks and camera views and performs several songs with them, thanks to the audio and video expertise of his incredible sound tech, Steve Supparits. This tour has been so successful that Carl has declared that he's now going to expand it nation- and possibly world-wide. The reason I make a big deal about this is essentially this: It's Mr. Palmer's recognition that the draw of the original sound of Emerson Lake & Palmer is undeniable. That realization justifies our presence as the preeminent ELP tribute show and demonstrates that, as more of Carl's and ELP's fans learn of Manticore's existence, more will come to both Carl Palmer's Legacy shows AND to Manticore shows, to get that full ELP experience! So spread the word, spread the joy and share the legacy!

But that's just the challenge that I deal with on a regular basis - presenting you with the best possible representation of an ELP experience, so that you'll come to more shows and leave satisfied each and every time AND so that you'll tell your friends about that experience and help us build this thing up to the grand spectacle that is worthy of its connection with Emerson Lake & Palmer!

As I mentioned last month, the Manticore 2023 calendar is rapidly filling up. We have our dates all set, up to next July, with some new, untested venues being added. We've had requests to bring Manticore to other parts of the nation and even other countries! Lately, I've been fielding requests from places like Texas, South Carolina, Ohio, California, New Hampshire, UK, Brazil and Australia. Sadly, with the limited resources and time available to us (2/3 of the band have businesses to run), we are

unable to satisfy many of those requests. We do our best to bring the music of ELP to as many places as we can that are within an 8 hour driving distance from NYC. If you know of any theaters or cabaret-type places that host tribute shows (and they're in an area that generally has decent turnout for prog shows), feel free to DM us



with the name and contact info for the venue and we'll cheerfully explore it. If you happen to have a connection to the venue, even better! I'm currently exploring some venues further west - in the area of Cleveland, Akron, Pittsburgh and like that - but I haven't gotten responses yet. Also,
